Let's recap volunteering at the 2025 lowa State Fair with a few facts and photos below:

- •Total number of volunteers: 670.
- •Volunteers filled 1,341 shifts over the course of the 11-day Fair.
- •Total number of hours volunteered: 5,280.
- •If we paid these volunteers \$12 per hour it would have reduced our fundraising total by more than \$63,000.
- •Volunteers sold 33,000 bottles of water. On average, the stands sold 500 bottles per day.

This success doesn't happen without dedicated volunteers who love the Fair and enjoy doing their part to see it thrive.


