Whether life-long east-siders, residents who live in the wider Des Moines metro, families who travel from various corners of our state, or even outside of Iowa - attending the Iowa State Fair is a tradition for so many.

Once inside the gates, where your group goes first and what attractions or concession stands you visit is generally the same Fair after Fair. For

families, the first request parents might hear from their kiddos is "let's go see the Butter Cow," or perhaps they beg to test their bravery on their favorite Thrill Park ride. Fairgoers just can't miss the activities that bring back those wonderful memories. It's comfortable and comforting to accomplish the goals tradition prescribes for Fairgoers.

Often, the most meaningful is the search for a family brick or time spent sitting on a bench honoring a loved one. This is where tradition comes full circle. For these Fairgoers, the stories that are told year after year - about where Grandpa and Grandma camped, about individuals who haven't missed a Fair, or about the generations who've shown livestock - all come down to doing something we love with friends and family. These stories are what make traditions so special.

Earlier this summer, the Blue Ribbon Foundation was contacted by Lisa Myers of Conroe, Texas. She needed help locating a bench honoring her grandparents, Edward and Lula Mander. Lisa planned to bring her grandson Cooper from Texas to experience the Iowa State Fair and learn more about Edward and Lula's love for the Fair. Staff was thrilled to be able to help her locate the bench and learn more about her family's connection to the Iowa State Fair.

Edward and Lula's enthusiasm for the Fair reflected their pride in being Iowa farmers. It was a chance to get away from the farm, after completing most of the summer work and before harvest. They traveled from their farm near Lawton in Northeast Iowa and stayed in their pickup camper on the campgrounds. Catching up with their campground "neighbors" was essential.

From her childhood, Lisa recalls joining Edward and Lula in these favorite Fair activities, seeing the Butter Cow, admiring the beautiful vegetables at the Agriculture Building, watching the cows being milked and grabbing ice cream at the Dairy Barn. The family would finish the day by listening to fiddlers and viewing the displays in Pioneer Hall.

"Bringing my grandson to the Fair that was so integral to my summers as I was growing up was incredibly special," said Lisa. "Cooper walked in the footsteps of his great-great grandparents during our time at the Fair, and we shared some quiet, restful moments seated on their bench. It felt like a circle had been completed bringing him to a place so laced with memories of my grandparents."

Thousands of Iowans enjoy similar traditions which are shared with us throughout the year. The Blue Ribbon Foundation is pleased to make these special opportunities available through our various giving programs for individuals who wish to commemorate traditions or honor their loved ones.

generous donors. The celebration raised
a total of \$766,684 toward the renovation
and preservation of the historic lowa State
Fairgrounds!

More than 2,000 lowa State Fair lovers gathered for a night full of fun and food in the William C. Knapp Varied Industries

Building to raise money for various projects around the grounds. The Blue Ribbon Foundation auctioned off 31 live and 283 silent auction packages.

- Thank you for supporting these specific improvement projects in 2024: Ye Old Mill, Agriculture Building ramp and doors, Jacobson Square, Iowa State Fair Police Headquarters, campgrounds bathhouse, water bottle refilling stations, paved handicapped parking lot, Hillcrest Dorm's roof, parking lot lighting and sidewalks by the Anne and Bill Riley Stage.
- The Blue Ribbon Foundation sold a record \$679,000 worth of merchandise during the Iowa State Fair. Top selling items were t-shirts, sweatshirts, hats and the Butter Cow stuffed animal. In addition, more than 65,000 bottles of water were sold. Both of these fundraisers wouldn't be possible without the help of our outstanding volunteers.
- The Sheep Barn renovation included the restoration of the brick, remodeled existing restrooms and added new ones, updated offices, repainted the interior, installation of underground storm sewer on the north, west, and east sides and new sun-shading for the show arena. The renovation will be complete with the installation of the restored terra cotta on the east end of the barn.
- Thank you to the Iowa Auctioneers Association for graciously donating the profits from their auctioneer showcase during the Fair. Congratulations to Quest Flesner, the Bid Calling Grand Champion at the event.
- Thank you to Painting with a Twist for offering painting classes to Fairgoers during the Iowa State Fair. The classes raised \$1,734 toward our mission. Participants truly enjoyed all the fun of the Fair and made memories they will cherish for many years to come.
- The Blue Ribbon Foundation hosted our BINGO fundraiser on the Grand Concourse for two days! 80 games were played each day with an average of 40 Fairgoers playing each game, helping the Blue Ribbon Foundation raise \$5,286.50.
- Thank you to everyone who purchased a raffle ticket for the luxury vacation in Turks and Caicos. The raffle raised \$19,050 toward our mission. We hope the winner enjoys their trip!
- The Woodcarvers' Auction raised \$78,146. All proceeds from the auction are dedicated to Our Fair's Future, the Blue Ribbon Foundation's endowment fund. A special thank you to Chainsaw Artists Gary Keenan, T.J. Jenkins and Clint Henik for producing such outstanding pieces of art.

As a retired teacher, she is actively involved in providing musical and educational programs to people of all ages by volunteering in multiple educational and community organizations. Tate's commitment to community service is evident through his participation in the Bellevue High School Silver Cord Program, and plans to join the Marines after graduation.

Rodd Holtkamp — Pringhar
Rodd has been an essential contributor to Primghar and O'Brien County for many years, actively involved in various community initiatives. His dedication has been demonstrated through his work with the MercyOne Hospital Foundation for two decades and serving on the original EMS Building Construction Committee. Rodd has also shown his commitment to the O'Brien County Fair by securing sponsors for four billboards to commemorate its 100th year.

He initiated a program for officers to read to young students, promoting positive relationships with the community. Post-retirement, Kendall remains actively involved in volunteer work, serving on various committees and organizations to give back to his community. He volunteers on election days, helps out at local community events, provides assistance to the people of Haiti, and supports veterans through "Moving Veterans Forward" of North Central Iowa by collecting and distributing furniture and household items.



DONOR PROFILE: ERNIE & PAULA BARNES

Many people claim to be Iowa State Fair enthusiasts or Fair fanatics. One couple truly earns their self-proclaimed "Fair Junkie" title. They have more than 50 combined years of service to the Iowa State Fair.

While Ernie grew up in Mississippi and Paula in Indiana, both were local fairgoers who were active in the agriculture industry. It felt natural for them not only to attend the State Fair when they moved to lowa in the mid 1980's, but also to fill leadership roles within the event.

Ernie volunteered in the livestock barns for five years before becoming the Swine Barn Superintendent. He has held this role for 22 years.

"Every morning, I'll drink my cup of coffee and sit on a bench outside of the Swine Barn," said Ernie. "The benches are in honor of icons in the pork industry. I reflect on how things have changed and improved. It's my favorite way to start the day."

Paula got involved with the Fair's volunteer program and took over as the Information Volunteer Superintendent in 2004. While Ernie stays busy in the Swine Barn, Paula fills her Fair days by managing 250 Information Booth volunteers. Paula takes pride knowing that volunteering at the Iowa State Fair is a family tradition. Many volunteers are retired couples and some are even a grandparent and grandchild duo.

"The Iowa State Fair is all about family," said Paula. "Our kids showed livestock, worked on the Blue Ribbon Foundation's water crew and our daughter was even the State Fair Queen in 2004."

Ernie and Paula have been involved with the Blue Ribbon Foundation since the organization was created in 1993. In fact, Ernie was one of the live auction ringmen at the very first Corndog Kickoff held in Pioneer Hall in 1997.

"The event was a success," said Ernie. "Even back then, the Blue Ribbon Foundation knew how to make those important connections with people that would lead to bigger and better things."

The first Corndog Kickoff raised \$67,000 and had 450 people in attendance. This past summer's event, in which Ernie continued his role as a ringmen, hosted 2,000 Fair lovers and raised \$766,684.

Both Paula and Ernie are so dedicated to their roles during the Iowa State Fair that they rarely see each other.

"We might be able to eat together once during the 11 days," said Ernie. "Otherwise we grab food from our favorite concessionaires and eat in the camper when we have a free minute. We are able to carve out more time to explore the Fairgrounds when the grandkids are here."

Paula's talents of event planning and organization don't end in August. The couple owns and operates "Barnes' Place," a wedding venue on their property in Adel. The venue is booked almost every weekend in the summer and fall, sometimes even having two weddings on the same weekend.

"I'll be bussing tables at a wedding reception and someone will recognize me from the Fair," said Ernie. "We'll get to talking and I'll get behind on my cleaning duties."

Ernie is full of Iowa State Fair stories and could probably strike up a conversation with just about anyone. As for Paula, one story she will always remember is the time that she and her granddaughter were walking into the Administration Building, and the granddaughter said, "Look! There's a brick with my mom's name."

Even with their differing duties and schedules, Paula and Ernie agree that it brings them great joy to reconnect with many friends who they see only once a year during Fairtime. The Iowa State Fair will forever be a special place for the Barnes family.
